

Advocating for paid traineeships would allow more people, especially historically marginalized people whom the field needs to graduate.

I loved the program, but I do not think that the first counseling class is needed for the program, it felt like an open class. I would have loved more classes on sexuality, spirituality, gender studies, and/or more cultural classes and how it can be intertwined with therapy and unraveling intergenerational trauma.

More role-playing from professors would be helpful--especially professors who also work with clients outside of teaching. This would help us gain a better understanding of ways to talk to our clients.

I had an exceptional experience!

I wish we had learned more about marketing ourselves and how to use social media to do so. I also wish we had taken a class that featured more information on aging, death, and spirituality.

Having a month dedicated in whichever class that includes Death and Dying and Grief would be appreciated.

I felt so supported by the professors in the program. It was excellent - my only suggestion would be to have a class that is focused on the business aspects of working in private practice for those that are interested - billing, boundaries with clients, marketing, etc.

The program was an exceptional life changing experience. The Ánimo Emphasis courses and professors dedication towards social justice and cultural competence is evident and have positively impacted me as a person and future counselor.

Should try harder to implement social Justice and multiculturalism within the curriculum that does not allow White students to easily avoid discussing these topics/issues

Research woven throughout, writing the lit review after focusing on self-reflection for much of the program made the shift back to research difficult.

In one of your courses, it could be a good idea to provide a demonstration of what it looks like when you first see a client for intake until termination.

I would have liked more structure on death and dying, quality of life for the elderly and those with terminal illnesses. I would have also liked more instruction in Spanish and writing/learning Spanish terminology in the Animo program.

Do not schedule heavy load/content classes together in the summer. It was draining to take the diagnosis/treatment class and ethics class at the same time during the Summer of 2020. Also, I had planned to take two classes every semester when I signed up for this program, and when we were scheduled to take three classes in Fall 2020, I almost quit. It was difficult to put add one more class to my life.

Please make additional comment/suggestions that you feel could improve the...

For students continuing to work with clients final semester, I feel less busy work (reflection papers, presentations, journals) and more consultation would be more beneficial.

I started seeing a professor after class for individual consultation/mini therapy sessions which I found extremely helpful. I'd encourage professors to talk with students one-on-one AT LEAST once a semester, especially since the pandemic has made significant emotional impacts on us all.
