

It may be helpful to have 1 designated person be the academic advisor for a cohort vs. meeting with multiple different professors/faculty along the way. It was tiring to continue explaining my need for certain classes/pacing multiple different times, so having 1 person who understands my situation and is trying to guide me along the program would have been helpful/streamlined my progress.

Cohort style - stay with the same group of students all the way through

Very good cultural diversity training and training in person-centered approach within this program. Training in family counseling was not thorough - I do not feel well-equipped to see families based on my education through this program. Career counseling was also not very well taught as I do not feel I learned much from the course.

Add optional additional courses for billing, marketing and private practice.

I suggest that faculty take ally training courses to better understand issues that other communities face such as LGBTQ+, Black/brown communities, & undocumented challenges. I had experiences where students made racist remarks and professors did not handle this well or even acknowledged the students' dehumanizing language.

More material on emotional and psychological development as counselors and how to manage that.
