




When to Take Assessment (CAS 310)





Adolescent/Youth (CHAY) Topical Development Classes

To fulfill concentration requirements, CHAY majors select **SIX** additional courses from the following list. We strongly recommend students select topical courses based on their professional interests, the requirements of graduate programs they will apply for, and the target populations they plan to work with.

Courses must meet these requirements:

- At least ONE course must be in the Diversity category.
- At least THREE courses must be CAS.
- At least **THREE** courses must be upper-division (i.e., having a number 300 or higher).

Important Reminders:

- At least 1 topical development class must be in each category.
- Community College equivalents may be accepted for up to 3 Topical Development Classes. The remaining 3 classes must be taken at CSUF.
- At least 3 Topical Development Courses must be upper division (course number of 300 or higher).

Considerations in Selecting Topical Development Courses:

- SOCI 303 also meets GE 2U; a statistics class is a prerequisite of some graduate programs.
- EDSC 330 and EDSC 340 are prerequisites for the single subject credential program.
- CHIC 332 meets GE 4U and meets a prerequisite requirement for the single subject credential program.
