What Should I Take in My First Semester?

This advice is for new transfer students with catalog years of Fall 2025 or later. Consult the [CAS Overview of the Major for Transfer Students](#) if you'd like more information.

I Will Be a Full-Time Student (4-5 Classes Per Semester)

It's important that you sign up for the foundational classes in the CAS Core Sequence if you want to graduate in a timely manner.

Step 1: Prioritize registering for these classes, which are available to juniors, in the CAS Core Sequence.

- CAS 200
- CAS 300
- CAS 301

Step 2: Review your previous coursework to determine if you've taken any of the following CAS Core Classes at your community college. (Check [this list](#) for what these courses may have been called at your community college if you're uncertain.)

If any of the following courses are missing, add them to your Fall 2025 schedule. Prioritize CAS 101 and CAS 201.

- CAS 101
- CAS 201
- SPED 371

Step 3: Fill the rest of your schedule out with the following options.

- GE course in Areas 3U or 4U
- CAS major topical development course for your concentration
- Prerequisite course for an intended credential or graduate program
