RECOGNIZING YOUR MERIT.

If you distinguish yourself academically and have a strong record of participation in extracurricular activities, you may qualify for a 2-, 3-, or 4-year merit-based scholarship. This may include allowances for books, monthly stipend, NCLEX* Prep Course, and clinical supply reimbursement. If you are applying while in high school, you could be eligible for the Army ROTC National Scholarship by starting the application after your junior year.

The following courses are required at most nursing schools prior to enrollment into the upper division of a BSN program. Applicants can distinguish themselves with strong academic achievements in these courses during high school:

- ⊕ MATH/STATISTICS
- ⊕ NATURAL SCIENCES: anatomy and physiology, chemistry with lab, microbiology with lab
- ⊕ SOCIAL SCIENCES: psychology/sociology/growth and development

*100% coverage for full tuition and fees based on merit and grades, and the option to cover room and board instead, for qualifying cases.

*NCLEX: National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses.
